Hulegaarden eller Hulegården stammer fra Ærø. Den originale har siden 1947 været placeret i Den Fynske Landsby. Den enlængede gårdform var tidligere meget udbredt på de sydfynske øer. Den originale gård lå på åben mark, ca. 2 km sydvest for Marstal, og ca. 100 m fra kysten. Ses bedst på luftfoto !

Den oprindelige gård blev bygget 1780. Det lille svine- og brændehus nord for stuehuset opførtes i 1838. Til gården hørte et areal på ca. 25 tdr. land; Hulegården var en relativ lille gård.

I 1840 købte Christen Lauritsen Christensen gården. Den yngste af hans sønner Christen Christensen (senere skoleinspektør ved Frederikssundsvejens skole i København) gav sine 3 sønner (Karl, Axel og Gustav) efternavnet Hulegaard.

Hulegaarden or Hulegården comes from the Island Aerøe. The original has since 1947 been placed in the Funen Village Museum (Odense). The one-arm form of yard was earlier very common on the southfunen islands. The original farm was placed on an open field about 100 meter from the coast. The farm was placed 2 km. southwest of the shipping-city Marstal on the east side of the island Aerøe. Please face the air-photo.

The original farm was built in 1780. The small house in front for pigs was built in 1838. The total size of land was about 34 acres, which is rather small yard.

Christen Lauritsen Christensen bought the farm in 1840. The youngest of his sons Christen Christensen (later Headmaster of a school in Copenhagen) blessed his 3 sons (Karl, Axel and Gustav) with the surname of Hulegaard.

Karl Hulegaards only grandchild/male ancestor is Erik Hulegaard = www.hulegaard.dk .
